Rational and aims

Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools recognise the importance of maintaining lines of communication with all stakeholders (parents and staff within the school, The Pioneer Academy, the wider community and outside agencies). We are committed to following our Personal Goals and believe that good communication between all these groups is essential to ensure positive engagement. We are also committed to being accessible and open to all those who have an interest in our school.

Children achieve more when everyone works together. Parents, governors and friends of the school can naturally support them better if they are aware and engaged in what the school wants to achieve. Effective communication fosters positive and respectful relationships within the school and promotes engagement with parents and the wider community.

This policy sets out to address the main ways in which Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools ensure effective, consistent, coherent communication both to internal and external stakeholders, to ensure their positive engagement in line with both the school's and TPA's ethos.

We strive to make written communications as accessible and inclusive as possible. We use Standard English, using inclusive and accessible language in an easy - to - read font and add pictures wherever appropriate. We seek to avoid bias, stereotyping or any form of discrimination. We recognise and celebrate the contributions made by all cultural and other groups represented in our school and community.

Throughout this policy, the use of the word parent encompasses all those with parental responsibility.

Home School Agreement

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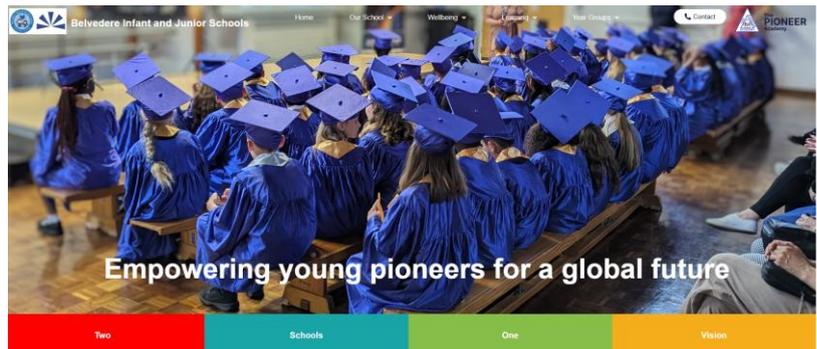


School communication to parents

Staff will contact parents to share information or share issues by letter, phone call, text message via Arbor, Class Dojo and in person. The school will also post information to the school website and to its social media accounts on Facebook and Instagram.

School website

Arbor



Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based Management Information System which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Parent App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. It is also our online payment system for trips, Breakfast Club, After School club and

much more. We are now a cash-free school. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go! The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Parent App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards). For additional instructions regarding logging into Arbor, see **Appendix 4**.

Class Dojo



Class Dojo is a secure platform of communication between staff and parents. Parents can join easily using any device and messages can be translated instantly into more than 30 different languages.

You will be invited to join Class Dojo when your child joins the school. It is important that you sign up to this

as not only will you receive information about school activities, you will also be able to connect to your child's teacher and vice versa. All information about school activities, including school trips etc. are put on Class Dojo. Teachers also use Class Dojo to promote positive behaviours in their classroom. Tapestry



In Nursery and Reception, Tapestry allows us to make observations for your children where we can attach photos and videos, as well as include assessments. We can use these to track children's development and progress.

On Tapestry, parents/guardians and other relatives can view, like and comment on the observations we make for your child/ren. You can also add your own observations of what your child does outside of the setting.

For additional instructions regarding logging into Tapestry, see **Appendix 6**.

Other means of communication

Each half term, a regular newsletter to all parents is published and shared on Class Dojo as well as the school website. It outlines what is being taught over the half term against each curriculum subject and practical information around organisation e.g. P.E days, when homework is issued and collected, book change days etc.

There are regular coffee mornings and workshops around various aspects of the national curriculum that parents are invited to attend throughout the school year. These are shared via the parents' calendar on Class Dojo, Arbor and displays around the school site.

Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools do send out other letters of a general nature when necessary, such as:

- Letters around out-of-school visits
- Invitations to EHCP annual reviews
- Letters regarding curriculum enrichments opportunities

This information can sometimes also be shared via Arbor as a notification message to a parent's phone.

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If a child is absent from school and no reason has been given, parents will be contacted by telephone on the same day to find out the reason for the absence. (Please refer to our Attendance Policy for further information).

If a child has an accident or becomes ill at school, we will try to contact parents by telephone to make them aware. Occasionally, in the case of a child becoming ill on school site, parents may be called and asked to take their child home from school. In the case of a minor accident first aid is administered and an email is sent directly to parents informing you of the accident and what first aid was administered. (Please refer to our Health and Safety Policy for further information).

Where an incident affects the whole school community, such as a power cut or adverse weather conditions, the school will send all parents a text message or email to make them aware. If the school is closed for more than one day, an update will be posted on the school website.

Parents will also be contacted by phone and could be asked to attend a meeting in line with our behaviour policy following a behaviour incident during the school day. (Please refer to our Behaviour Policy for further information)

Reporting Children's progress and attainment

Parents Evenings

Parents evenings provide parents with the opportunity to meet their child's teacher in a private parent-teacher consultation. This gives parents the opportunity to celebrate their child's successes and to further support their child where needed. Before, during and after these meetings parents have the opportunity to see their child's work.

Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools provide parents with the opportunity to meet with teachers at three points during the academic year:

- *Autumn Term* - Towards the end of the first half of the Autumn Term, parents are invited into school for an informal parents' evening to meet their child's new teacher and discuss how they are settling into their new year group.
- *Spring Term* - In the second half of the spring term, parents are invited into school to meet with their child's class teacher to discuss their child's progress and attainment over the previous school term.
- *Summer Term* - This is the final parent's evening where parents and teachers discuss progress and attainment over the academic year.

Written Reports

In line with the final Parents' Evening, parents will also receive a written report detailing their child's progress and attainment against the national curriculum. This report will identify areas of strength and areas for future development. We also give children and their parents in Year 6 details of their performance in KS2 SATS.

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Parents of Children with Special Educational Needs

In addition to the communication methods outlined above, parents of children with SEND may be invited to additional meetings in order to review specific targets and keep all stakeholders aware of any additional educational provision. Parents of children with an Educational Health Care Plan will also be invited to attend an annual review of their child's EHCP plan.

Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools welcome the presence of any adult a parent may wish to invite to a school meeting such as an interpreter, advocate, friend or family member. We also endeavour to make interpreters available when required.

Public Access Documents

Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools makes a range of documentation including; national statutory guidance, The Pioneer Academy guidance and school policies, including Relationship and Sex Education, The SEND Information Report and Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy available to parents via the school website (A full list of these documents can be found in **Appendix 7**) Parents can ask at reception for a printed copy of any of these documents.

Parents communication to school

Parents may contact school to share information or concerns in person or by phone, letter or e-mail.

Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools encourage parents to share any information or concerns around their child at the earliest opportunity. Usually, these concerns are best addressed by a child's class teacher or Year Group Lead.

All parents have the opportunity to have a brief and informal touch in with class teachers at the dismissal daily. If it is more appropriate to have a private or longer meeting to communicate information or concerns with a class teacher an appointment can be requested, if this is not possible at the time, then an appointment can be made for nearest mutually convenient time.

Senior Leaders all have duties at the beginning and the end of the school day and are also available for brief and informal touch-ins with parents at these times. As outlined above; a private or longer meeting can be requested, if this is not possible at the time, then an appointment can be made for the nearest mutually convenient time.

Parents can also request to meet with specific members of staff through the main school office in person, through a letter, via a phone call or e-mail to the school administration e-mail address:

We ask that parents do not e-mail school staff directly.

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The following response times following a parental request for a meeting are usually adhered to:

Communication from Parent	Suggested Response Time
Phone call	Within 24 hours
Email	Within 3 - 5 working days
Written Letter	Within 3 - 5 working days

If a face-to-face meeting is not possible then a phone call conversation can be scheduled at a mutually convenient time. Please do note that any concerns detailed in an e-mail will be responded to, in the first instance, with an acknowledgement e-mail and a request for a meeting with the appropriate member of staff.

If parents feel any concerns were not resolved or appropriately addressed, they may wish to escalate their concern through requesting a meeting with a member of the Senior Leadership Team using the procedure set out above.

If a satisfactory resolution has not been found, following a meeting, a parent will be informed that s/he will need to consider whether to make a formal complaint to the Executive Headteacher. A complaint can be made in person, in writing or by telephone. Please see the school website for a copy of our concerns and complaints policy or ask for a copy at the school office.

Letters or e-mails received by staff and their replies will be kept on file. Letters to parents will be approved by the Executive Headteacher (or delegated member of SLT) before being sent out.

Consultation and co-production

Consultation between school and parents takes place in a variety of ways depending on the consultation.

Each parents' evening questionnaires are issued to parents through hard copies to address key issues such as the school curriculum, uniform, quality and accessibility of the school's materials etc.

Where possible, parents are asked to be part of steering groups, alongside other stakeholders to share their views or co-produce school policies or processes.

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Appendix 1

Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools Home/School Agreement

The School will:

- create a safe and happy environment where children are able to learn and thrive
- value your child as an individual and for the contribution your child can make to the life of the school
- provide a safe, secure and caring environment in which your child is fully aware of behavioural expectations and support the school when applying the policy
- provide an inclusive, challenging and stimulating curriculum to suit your child's needs
- encourage your child to do their personal best at all times
- keep you informed about general school matters, and about your child's progress
- encourage, praise and positively reinforce good relationships, work and behaviour
- deal carefully with concerns and complaints, as set out in the school's complaints procedure
- welcome parents at all times and offer opportunities for you to become involved in the daily life of the school
- celebrate children's cultures and ethnic backgrounds
- offer experiences and curricular clubs which enhance and support learning

As a child at the school, I will:

- wear the correct uniform at all times
- be responsible for my homework and reading book
- follow the school rules
- make sensible choices with regards to my behaviour at all times
- show respect for others

Parents/Carers and Staff will:

- support the child's development and well-being
- recognise and provide support for any special educational needs; learning development difficulties or disabilities
- encourage the child to become an active and responsible member of the wider community

Parents/Carers will:

- ensure that my/our child attends school regularly, in good health; arrives on time each morning and is picked up promptly at the end of the day (**see attendance policy**)
- inform the school of the reason for any absence on the first day of absence
- avoid taking holidays during term time
- support the school's policies and guidelines for work and behaviour

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- ensure that my child attends school wearing the correct school uniform (or PE kit), including shoes and hair accessories, and not wearing jewellery that does not follow our uniform policy (***see uniform policy***)
- ensure that my child brings a refillable water bottle and a book bag to school every day
- be realistic about my/our child's abilities: always encouraging them in their efforts and praise them for their achievements
- participate in discussions concerning my/our child's progress, in particular, attending all Parent meetings
- make early contact with the school to discuss any matters which might affect my/our child's happiness, well-being, progress or behaviour, e.g., family bereavements, parents separating or accidents
- read the School's Safeguarding Policy and understand that the school needs to record any concerns relating to safeguarding and that they will contact the safeguarding team and/or share information with other agencies if required.
- understand that the use of physical force in disciplining children may be illegal in certain circumstances - including where an implement has been used or where the use of that force has resulted in visible injury and the use of prolonged physical stress positions. I understand in these circumstances the school has a statutory duty to report such incidents to Children's Social Care and that the police may be asked to investigate.
- give 'home learning' its due importance, by, for example, encouraging and hearing reading
- sign up to our school communications on Arbor and Class Dojo and read correspondence from the school which contains important information
- communicate in a respectful and constructive manner with other members of the school community
- refund the school for any lost or damaged books or equipment.
- agree with the parental code of conduct

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Appendix 2

Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools Parental Code of Conduct

At Belvedere Infant and Juniors schools, we are very fortunate to have a supportive and friendly parent body. Our parents recognise that educating children is a process that involves partnership between parents, class teachers and the school community. As a partnership, our parents will understand the importance of a good working relationship to equip children with the necessary skills for adulthood. For these reasons we continue to welcome and encourage parents to participate fully in the life of our school.

The purpose of this code of conduct is to provide a reminder to all parents visiting our school about the expected conduct. This is so we can continue to flourish, progress and achieve in an atmosphere of mutual understanding.

We expect parents and visitors to:

- ✓ Respect the caring ethos and values of our school.
- ✓ Understand that both teachers and parents need to work together for the benefit of their children.
- ✓ Demonstrate that all members of the school community should be treated with respect and therefore set a good example in their own speech and behaviour.
- ✓ Seek to clarify a child's version of events with the school's view in order to bring about a peaceful solution to any issue.
- ✓ Correct own child's behaviour especially in public where it could otherwise lead to conflict, aggressive behaviour or unsafe behaviour.
- ✓ Approach the school to help resolve any issues of concern.
- ✓ Avoid using staff as threats to admonish children's behaviour.

In order to support a peaceful and safe school environment the school cannot tolerate parents and visitors exhibiting the following:

- ✗ Disruptive behaviour which interferes or threatens to interfere with the operation of a classroom, an employee's office, office area or any other area of the school grounds including team matches.
- ✗ Using loud/or offensive language, swearing, cursing, using profane language or displaying temper.
- ✗ Threatening to do actual bodily harm to a member of school staff, Governor, visitor, fellow parent/carer or student regardless of whether or not the behaviour constitutes a criminal offence.
- ✗ Damaging or destroying school property.
- ✗ The use of physical aggression towards another adult or child.
- ✗ Approaching someone else's child in order to discuss or chastise them because of the actions of this child towards their own child. (Such an approach to a child may be seen to be an assault on that child and may have legal consequences).
- ✗ Smoking/vaping and consumption of alcohol or other drugs whilst on school property.
- ✗ Dogs being brought on to school premises.
- ✗ Abusive or threatening e-mails or text/voicemail/phone messages or other written communication.

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- ✗ Defamatory, offensive or derogatory comments regarding the school or any of the students/parent/staff, at the school on Facebook or other social sites. social media including WhatsApp School Groups or other social sites. Any concerns I have will be raised directly with the school (please see Social Media Code of Conduct)
- ✗ Requesting to follow or befriend school staff on social media

Should any of the above behaviour occur on school premises the school may feel it is necessary to contact the appropriate authorities and if necessary, even ban the offending adult from entering the school grounds.

Persons Causing Nuisance / Disturbance on School Premises

Section 547 of the Education Act 1996

School premises are private property and parents have been granted permission from the school to be on school premises. However, in case of abuse or threats to staff, pupils or other parents, school may ban parents from entering school.

It is also an offence under section 547 of the Education Act 1996 for any person (including a parent) to cause a nuisance or disturbance on school premises. The police may be called to assist in removing the person concerned.

School is not responsible for organising arrangements for children in the above circumstances. Parents will need to provide alternative arrangements for bringing children into school.

We trust that parents will assist our school with the implementation of this policy and we thank you for your continuing support of the school.

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Appendix 3

Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools Social Media Code of Conduct

Belvedere Infant and Junior schools understand and appreciate the benefits of social media; however, there may also be some significant negative impacts, such as cyber bullying, which the school does not tolerate. To set the best example possible to pupils, the school asks parents to also lead by example.

Social media websites are being used increasingly to fuel campaigns and complaints against schools, Headteachers, school staff, and in some cases other parents/students. The Governors considers the use of social media websites being used in this way as unacceptable and not in the best interests of the children or the whole school community.

Any concerns you may have must be made through the appropriate channels by speaking to the class teacher, the Headteacher or the Chair of Governors, so they can be dealt with fairly, appropriately and effectively for all concerned.

In the event that any student or parent of a child/ren being educated in the school is found to be posting libellous or defamatory comments on Facebook or other social network sites, they will be reported to the appropriate 'report abuse' section of the network site. All social network sites have clear rules about the content, which can be posted, on the site and they provide robust mechanisms to report content or activity which breaches this. The school will also expect that any parent/carer or student removes such comments immediately.

In serious cases the school will also consider its legal options to deal with any such misuse of social networking and other sites. Additionally, and perhaps more importantly is the issue of cyber bullying and the use by one child or a parent to publicly humiliate another by inappropriate social network entry. We will take and deal with this as a serious incident of school bullying. Thankfully such incidents are extremely rare.

Arbor offers you the freedom to make payments whenever and wherever you like, 24 hours a day, seven days a week - safe in the knowledge that the technology used is of the highest internet security available. You will have a secure online account, activated using your own unique username and password. Class Dojo is a secure platform of communication between staff and parents. Parents can join easily using any device and messages can be translated instantly into more than 30 different languages.

You will be invited to join Class Dojo when your child joins the school. It is important that you sign up to this as not only will you receive information about school activities, you will also be able to connect to your child's teacher and vice versa. All information about school activities, including school trips etc. are put on Class Dojo. When joining, please note that **this service is free and you will not need to pay for it.** You will receive a unique email to create a parent account so that teachers can send a unique code or link for your child's account. Class Dojo can be used on any device – it's a simple, free mobile app for iOS and Android (please do not pay for upgraded version), and can also be accessed from your computer at classdojo.com.

Class Dojo is for quick updates for whole class, year group or the whole school. Staff will not discuss individual incidents that might have happened in school. For anything important, sensitive or timely, staff will contact you more formally face to face or call you. Please also note that staff will only post and respond to parents during working hours (not weekends and school holidays) which are set from 8.30am to 5.00pm.

Features –

Stories

Stories are instantly updating streams of messages, pictures and videos similar to a social media-style timeline. Every class and school have their own story, all of which are shared at home with all parents/carers. Class Story helps teachers to share photos, messages, updates with all families connected to their class, whilst the School Story regularly shares whole school news features.

Messages

Messages allow teachers and parents to instantly message each other, without needing to share phone numbers or contact details. Messages can be translated into 30+ different languages. Messages sent out of hours will not be seen by the teacher until the next working day. Our quiet hours are before 8.30am, and after 5pm. You are welcome to message in our quiet times, but please note that you will not get a response.

Dojo Points

Teachers use Class Dojo to promote positive behaviours in their classroom. Each child gets a monster avatar, and teachers can award Dojos for things such as staying on task, showing excellent manners, fantastic teamwork or amazing kindness.

Class Dojo points are given at the end of every day based on where they finish on the green triangle. At the end of each week, the three children with the highest number of points will receive a Dojo certificate.

On Tapestry, parents/guardians and other relatives can view, like and comment on the observations we make for your child/ren. You can also add your own observations of what your child does outside of the setting.

You can also be notified via email either immediately, daily or weekly if there are new entries for you to view.

If you give your permission, we will set you up with your own individual account using your email address. This account will be directly linked to your child/ren’s account/s, which means you will only see your own child’s bservations. You will then be able to login with your email address and password to either the browser version of Tapestry (tapestryjournal.com) or to the app. Tapestry has apps for iOS, Android and Amazon Fire devices. If you choose to use the app, after you login initially, you can use a 4-digit PIN to quickly log back in.

Who processes your information?

Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools are the data controllers of the personal information you provide to us. This means the school determines the purposes for which, and the manner in which, any personal data relating to pupils and their families is to be processed.

In some cases, your data will be outsourced to a third-party processor; however, this will only be done with your consent, unless the law requires the school to share your data. Where the school outsources data to a third-party processor, the same data protection standards that Belvedere Infant School upholds are imposed on the processor.

Why do we collect and use your information?

Belvedere Infant and Junior schools hold the legal right to collect and use personal data relating to pupils and their families, and we may also receive information regarding them from their previous school, LA and/or the DfE. We collect and use personal data in order to meet legal requirements and legitimate interests set out in the UK GDPR and UK law, including those in relation to the following:

- Article 6 and Article 9 of the GDPR
- Education Act 1996
- Regulation 5 of The Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013

In accordance with the above, the personal data of pupils and their families is collected and used for the following reasons:

- To support pupil learning
- To monitor and report on pupil progress
- To provide appropriate pastoral care
- To assess the quality of our service
- To comply with the law regarding data sharing

Which data is collected?

The categories of pupil information that the school collects, holds and shares include the following:

- Personal information – e.g. names, pupil numbers and addresses
- Characteristics – e.g. ethnicity, language, nationality, country of birth and free school meal eligibility
- Attendance information – e.g. number of absences and absence reasons
- Assessment information – e.g. national curriculum assessment results
- Relevant medical information
- Information relating to SEND
- Behavioural information – e.g. number of temporary exclusions

Whilst the majority of the personal data you provide to the school is mandatory, some is provided on a voluntary basis. When collecting data, the school will inform you whether you are required to provide this data or if your consent is needed. Where consent is required, the school will provide you with specific and explicit information with regards to the reasons the data is being collected and how the data will be used.

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How long is your data stored for?

Personal data relating to pupils at Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools and their families are stored in line with the school's GDPR Data Protection Policy.

In accordance with the UK GDPR, the school does not store personal data indefinitely; data is only stored for as long as is necessary to complete the task for which it was originally collected.

Will my information be shared?

The school is required to share pupils' data with the DfE on a statutory basis.

The National Pupil Database (NPD) is managed by the DfE and contains information about pupils in schools in England. Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools are required by law to provide information about our pupils to the DfE as part of statutory data collections, such as the school census; some of this information is then stored in the NPD. The DfE may share information about our pupils from the NDP with third parties who promote the education or wellbeing of children in England by:

- Conducting research or analysis.
- Producing statistics.
- Providing information, advice or guidance.

The DfE has robust processes in place to ensure the confidentiality of any data shared from the NDP is maintained.

Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools will not share your personal information with any third parties without your consent, unless the law allows us to do so. The school routinely shares pupils' information with:

- Pupils' destinations upon leaving the school
- The LA
- The NHS

What are your rights?

Parents and pupils have the following rights in relation to the processing of their personal data.

You have the right to:

- Be told how we use your information.
- Ask to see the information we hold.
- Ask us to change information you think is wrong.
- Ask us to remove information when it is not needed anymore.
- Ask us to only use your information in certain ways.
- Tell us you don't want your information to be processed.
- Say no to direct marketing (people trying to sell you things).
- Stop people using your information for scientific, research or statistical purposes.

Where the processing of your data is based on your consent, you have the right to withdraw this at any time. If you have a concern about the way Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools and/or the DfE is collecting or using your personal data, you can raise a concern with the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO). The ICO can be contacted on 0303 123 1113, Monday-Friday 9am-5pm.

Food and Drink

Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools are pleased to inform you that we use Nourish as our school meals provider. A sample menu is enclosed. Children of infant and junior school age are entitled to a school lunch free of charge (universal free school meals). The food is of high quality and there is a choice of meals every day. A range of dietary requirements are provided for and there is always a vegetarian option.

We would like to inform parents who choose to provide their child with a packed lunch that we are a healthy school and packed lunches should be nutritionally balanced.

Packed Lunch Suggestions

- ✓ Wholemeal or granary bread/wraps/pittas/bagels
- ✓ Fillings - chicken, turkey, tuna, reduced fat cream cheese/hard cheese
- ✓ Salads
- ✓ Vegetables i.e., cherry tomatoes, sticks of carrots, cucumber, celery, peppers
- ✓ Fruit
- ✓ Yoghurt
- ✓ A still drink in a flask or plastic screw top bottle.

Children are ***not*** to bring:

- ✗ **Nuts or nut products** (including flapjacks). These are not permitted because of severe life-threatening allergic reaction by some pupils to these products.
- ✗ Chocolate spread sandwiches
- ✗ Sweets or chocolate bars
- ✗ Cartons or drinks in foil pouches. The foil pouches are difficult to open and often spill easily and the cartons sometimes do not have a straw attached.

Nursery, Reception and KS1 (Year 1 and Year 2)

Our school takes part in the National School Fruit Scheme for 4- to 6-year-olds. Under the Scheme, each child will be entitled to a free piece of fruit each school day.

Your child will be offered a free piece of fruit each day at morning break time. The fruit will be fresh and of good quality, equivalent to the fruit that we buy in the shops. The aim is for the children to have a positive and enjoyable experience of fruit.

The Scheme is voluntary and there is no obligation for your child to take part. We are keen to help our children to enjoy eating fruit and the Scheme will help us to teach them the benefits of healthy eating.

If your child has an allergy to any fruit, please ensure that you have informed us by completing the dietary section in section 2 of the admission form.

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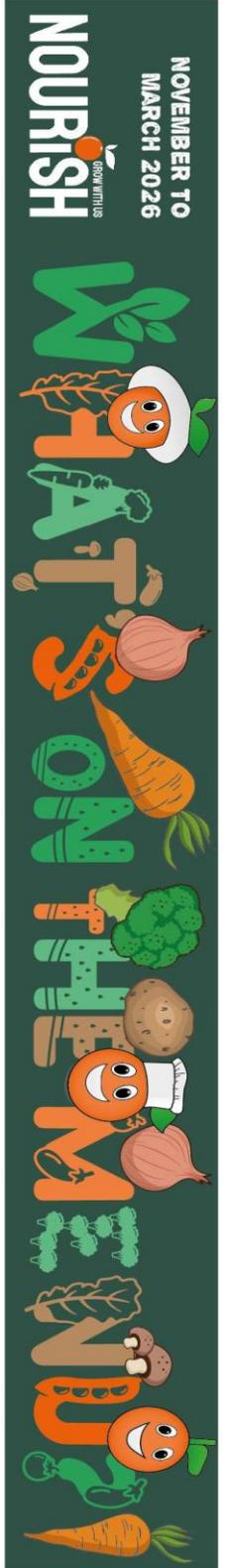

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Appendix 19

Attendance information

Registration

Children must attend school punctually and regularly:

- Nursery AM start at 08.30 am – gates open at 8.25am and close at 8.35am
- Nursery PM start 12.30pm – gates open 12.25pm and close at 12.35pm
- KS1 (Reception classes and Years 1 and 2) start at 8.55am
- KS2 (Years 3 - 6) start at 8.55am.

The school gates open at 8.35am for Reception and KS1 and 8.45am for KS2 each day and children are expected to be in class by 8.55am when the register will be taken. Registers will close at 9.00am. Any child arriving after 9.00am must be signed in by their parent/carer at the school office and will be marked as late in the register with an 'L' code.

Any arrival after 9.30am will be marked as 'unauthorised absence' with a 'U' code (unless the child is late because of a valid, agreed prior appointment).

Reporting an Absence

If a child is absent, there are only two methods for reporting this:

Infant Child:

- Call the school office on 0208 311 9092 and press 1 to report a child absence, please leave a voicemail if necessary.
- Email the school office at admin@belvedere-inf.bexley.sch.uk with your child's name, class and details of their illness.

Junior Child

- Call the school office on 01322 431404 and press 1 for report a child absence, please leave a voicemail if necessary.
- Email the school office at admin@bjs.bexley.sch.uk with your child's name, class and details of their illness.

Messages must state the child's full name, class and exact details of all symptoms – 'not feeling well' or 'feeling tired' are not symptoms.

If your child has minor symptoms for example, sniffles, feeling fatigued, they are expected to attend school.

We will of course monitor them, and contact parents/carers should we feel the need to. Alternatively, should your child wake up poorly and their symptoms improve, they should then be brought to school even though they may have missed morning registration as they will receive their afternoon session mark.

Parents are required to notify the school of their child's absence using either of the above two reporting methods by 9.00am on each day of absence.

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Late Attendance

Parents must make every effort to have their children in school at the correct time to ensure they do not miss key learning. If your child is noted as being late to school frequently, an email will be sent to parents/carers to bring the lateness to their attention as a first stage. If the lateness persists, a formal letter will be sent by the Attendance Officer reminding parents/carers of their responsibility to ensure children arrive at school on time each day. Should there be no improvement, the Headteacher will write personally to the parents/carers and may decide to refer the matter to the Education Welfare Officer. See Appendixes 1 and 2 for examples of these letters.

Concerns around Attendance and Punctuality

If we do not receive communication via a telephone call or voice message on the first day of absence by 9.00am, we will send a message to the parent/carer via Arbor requesting the reason as to why the child is not in school. If no response is forthcoming within 30 mins, a phone call home will be made. Then the absence will be recorded as unauthorised ('O' code) on their attendance record.

If we have previous concerns about a child's welfare (for example, the child is on the child protection register or we believe could be in danger), we may request that our Education Welfare Officer (EWO) complete an unscheduled home visit. If we continue to have concerns, then we would seek support from other agencies to safeguard the child, including the Police and Children's Services.

Where attendance is a concern, parents/carers may be required to provide medical evidence when the child returns so that the absence is not recorded as unauthorised. Parents/carers will be notified of this arrangement by letter. See Appendixes 3 and 4 for examples of these. In cases of significant concern the school, in collaboration with the EWO make take further steps such as the issuing of fixed penalty notices or seeking the issue of an attendance order.

Possible triggers for attendance letters could be as follows, please note this is not an exhaustive list of triggers and each case is considered on its own merit:

- Attendance is below 96%
- Frequent 'Lates' after the register has closed
- Unexplained or unauthorised absences
- Patterns forming regarding absences, for example regular Fridays and Monday absence from school.

Collecting Your Child Before the End of the School Day

We expect your child to attend school for the whole day (i.e. both morning and afternoon sessions). It is recognised however, that there may be some occasions/circumstances whereby it might be necessary to collect your child earlier than 3.15pm at the Infants or 3.20pm at the Juniors. Early collection will only be permitted by prior request/agreement in writing (email) from the parent/carer, confirming the reason for the early collection, who will be collecting and the time. In the event one child needs to be collected early, we would not normally expect siblings to be collected at the same time. After School Club should be considered by parents as an alternative to collecting siblings or collecting children for a reason not directly relevant, for example a parent's medical appointment.

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Term Time Absence

Children should attend school for the maximum number of days possible (190), since absences can have a detrimental effect on their learning.

Parents receive a list of holiday dates at the beginning of each academic year; these can be found on the school's webpage: <https://belvedereschools.bexley.sch.uk/>. Families are expected to take their holidays outside term time.

If you require absence for any other circumstances, we ask that you fill in a 'Request for Term Time Absence' form and attach any additional information required such as outgoing/returning flight details. (see Appendix 5 and the school website: <https://belvedereschools.bexley.sch.uk/>) Such requests should be kept to a minimum and should not, in any case, exceed two weeks (10 days) during a school year.

The Head Teacher will consider your request and your 'Term Time Absence' will either be approved or not; in either case, you will receive an email/letter confirming the outcome (see Appendix 6 and 7 for examples of these letters). Any absence the day before or the day after a school holiday will be unauthorised ('O' code) unless evidence is provided.

If it is not exceptional circumstances and you nevertheless take your child out of school, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

In the case of an unauthorised holiday for 5 consecutive days or more the Education Welfare Service will be notified and a Penalty Notice may be issued. Please note that such a Penalty is issued to each parent for each child taken out of school.

First Offence

- A penalty notice for £160 per parent, per child (reduced to £80 per parent if paid in 21 days)

Second Offence (within 3 years of first offence)

-A penalty notice for £160 per parent, per child (no reduction for early payment)

Third Offence (within 3 years of the first offence)

-A penalty notice will not be issued; the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates Court. Fines can be around £2,500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in the Magistrates Court can show as a criminal record and also on a parent's future DBS certificates due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education)

Attendance at Funerals

Requests for attendance at funeral for family members should be submitted as a 'Term Time Absence'. To ensure equal treatment throughout the school, only one day's absence will be authorised to attend the funeral service itself, travelling time will not be authorised unless included as part of the day's absence.

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Attendance at School Open Mornings / Entrance Exams (applicable for Year 6 only during the months of September/October)

Time off to attend Secondary School Open Mornings or Entrance Exams will be authorised, however, your child is expected to be in school for the other part of the day. Days off for revision prior to the Entrance Exam will not be authorised. Parents should report their child's absence for the morning or afternoon session using the normal Daily Absence Reporting Notification procedure, confirming for which session their child will be absent and which school they will be attending.

Celebrating attendance

We celebrate whole class attendance in Achievement Assembly every Friday to congratulate all classes reaching 96% +. Class attendance will be displayed near the main office to show results each week. The class with the highest attendance each week will receive the Attendance Cup which will be proudly displayed in the classroom all week. We also share any class with 100% attendance on Class Dojo.

Long Term Absence

When children have an illness, which means that they will be away from school for over five days, the school may signpost and encourage children to access Class Dojo where the class teacher will upload work for the child to complete at home.

If the absence is likely to continue for an extended period, or be a repetitive absence, the school will contact the appropriate support services, so that arrangements can be made for the child to be given some tuition outside school.

SEND- and health-related absences

The school recognises that pupils with SEND and/or health conditions, including mental health issues, may face greater barriers to attendance than their peers, and will incorporate robust procedures to support pupils who find attending school difficult.

In line with the SEND Policy and Supporting Pupils with Medical Conditions Policy, the school will ensure that reasonable adjustments are made for disabled pupils to reduce barriers to attendance, in line with any EHC plans or IHPs that have been implemented. The school will secure additional support from external partners to help bolster attendance where appropriate.

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Uniform expectations

School uniform

- Skirts must be knee length and pupils who wear them must also wear dark **grey tights**.
- Trainers are not considered suitable footwear. High heels are not permitted; however, block heels of no more than 3cm can be worn.

Jewellery

- Jewellery is NOT permitted in school. Earrings should be studs only (taped for PE if necessary).
- Jewellery is the responsibility of the pupil and not the school. Lost or damaged items will not be refunded. All jewellery must be removed during practical lessons.

School bag

School bags featuring inappropriate images, slogans or phrases are not permitted. The school encourages pupils to bring in non-valuable bags and school will not be liable for lost/ damaged bags.

Hairstyles

The school reserves the right to make a judgement on where pupils' hairstyles or hair colours are inappropriate for the school environment; however, will ensure that any such judgements do not discriminate against any pupil by virtue of their protected characteristics. Each individual pupil's scenario will be taken into account where any judgements on appropriateness are to be made, and parents will always have the freedom to complain via the school's Concerns and Complaints Policy.

Pupils with long hair must ensure that this does not impede their vision, cover their face or provide a health and safety risk. Long hair must be tied up during practical lessons, e.g. during PE.

Coats and winter outer wear

Children should wear weather-appropriate outer wear for the time of year, even if it appears warm on arrival, the weather can change throughout the school day. Children can bring in hats, scarves and gloves. It is essential that these are also clearly labelled.

Labelling

All pupils' clothing and footwear **MUST** be clearly labelled with their full name. This helps considerably when it comes to returning lost or missing items to their owner.

Lost property

Any lost clothing is to be taken to the lost property box in the school office (Infants) and in the bike shed/lean to (Juniors). All lost property is retained for one week and is disposed of if it is not collected within this time.

Pupil Premium

Children who attend Belvedere Infant and Junior Schools are eligible for school uniform assistance **if they are in receipt of pupil premium**. This is open to children in Reception to Year 6. Please contact the office who will let you know if you are eligible.

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
